The court allowed the quashing of the FIR registered under Sections 8, 12 and 17 of the Protection Of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 after the father of the victim and the accused entered into a 'cordial settlement' in an amicable manner. Do you think compromise should be allowed under the POCSO Act keeping in mind the aim of the legislature in enacting the POCSO Act and the latest amendments made in the Act in 2019 to "deter the perpetrators and ensure safety" of the child?
