The Indian Judiciary has played a proactive role for the improvement of prisons but still the issues relating to prisons in the country and their reform continue to pose a big hurdle in criminal justice system." Enumerate the various issues and reforms in the current Prison system.

- Q. 3 "Restorative Justice must be victim-centred, voluntary, evidence-based, and those programs that are evidence-based must receive adequate funding, and the mandate must not include to reduce penalties." Discuss. (20 Marks)
